HAPPY NEW YEAR FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND MANAGEMENT: We have much to be grateful for, particularly all our neighbors and the people who make this such a wonderful community. It is our wish that you have a prosperous new year in your work and play, and with your family and friends. Again, Happy New Year!

<u>COLD WEATHER REMINDERS</u>: As we move into winter and prepare for snow and colder temperatures, we have a few winter weather reminders:

- 1. <u>ICE:</u> The cold, wet weather can bring slippery conditions. Please be careful and take caution as you move around Barrington Park as there will be areas that may have snow and ice. Ice Melt (not salt) is available to help control slippery surfaces. You can pick ice melt up in the office or request maintenance to deliver it by emailing us at <u>office@barringtonparkhoa.com</u>.
- 2. SNOW REMOVAL:
 - Snow removal is completed when storms accumulate a depth of 2 or more inches.
 - Streets: Streets are given priority. The first areas are the entrances and around the post office, followed by the main streets and finally the side streets. Please remember <u>no parking on the streets overnight and</u> <u>no parking overnight in guest parking without permits.</u>
 - Sidewalks and driveways: As with street plowing, sidewalks and driveways are completed on a priority system. First the post office, next the major walking areas then the rest of the drives and walks. In other words, they will eventually get to you and are happy to do so. It simply takes time, so please be a little patient with us and know we will get to you. Any help that is provided by you is appreciated and expedites the whole snow removal process. The crew does not remove snow from patio or deck areas.
- 3. <u>HOSE BIBS</u>: Just a reminder, be sure your outside hose is disconnected from the hose bib and turn the water off to the hose bib either by a valve inside your home or that a freeze-free valve is installed and working properly

TOWING RULES: We have had several vehicles towed from Barrington over the last month. Don't let your vehicle or the vehicle of your visitor, family or friends be next.

REMINDER!!! Street parking IS NOT allowed between midnight and 6 am. Don't risk it. There is a very high likelihood that your vehicle will be towed at your expense!!

If you need a parking permit for the visitor parking areas, please stop by, call or email the office and obtain a permit so that you are not in violation. Parking permits DO NOT allow for street parking. Additionally, while parking on the street during the day is not a violation, it certainly creates challenges for snow removal, delivery services, waste removal and emergency vehicle access.

Thank you for your assistance with this by parking in your driveway or designated parking areas, instead of the street.

FREEZING PIPES: No matter how new or old homes are, pipes that are in exterior walls can be susceptible to freezing when temperatures get cold. That is true of those pipes under sinks where no heat can get to the wall. When you believe the temperature is going to be cold for a period, open the cabinet doors and let some heat get to those walls. For areas such as showers or bathtubs, it wouldn't hurt to let a little water trickle just while it is cold. Along with freezing pipes be sure your outside hose is disconnected from the hose bib, and you want to be sure you can turn the water off to the hose either by a valve inside your home or that a freeze free valve is installed and working properly.

<u>CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS</u>: Homeowners should be pleased with the way Barrington Park looked during the Holidays. There were many great decorations, and it made the whole community look and feel festive. The Board wants to thank all those that decorated. So that Barrington will look well kept, please remove your decorations before January 16, 2025, weather permitting. If you put your Christmas trees at the curb, our maintenance crew will haul them off to the recyclers.
